B. COACHES & SKIPS MEETING

- The **mandatory** Coaches/Captains meeting will take place via Zoom at 7:00pm on Tuesday, February 17th.

C. SCHEDULE / OPENING CEREMONIES

- Opening Ceremonies will take place at 11:00 am after the first draw on Thursday February 19th.
- Athletes and coaches should be in the downstairs viewing area dressed in their competition gear 15 minutes prior to the start of the ceremony. The ceremonies will follow the following format:
 - Teams Lineup in alphabetical order - Girls, Boys, Mixed
 - Teams led into ice area by piper and Junior Rocks members
 - Land Acknowledgement
 - O'Canada
 - Welcome and Opening Remarks
 - Athlete's Oath
 - Ceremonial First Rock
 - Athletes led off ice by piper
 - Medal Presentations will take place in the upstairs viewing area after each medal competition.

D. REGISTRATION

Fees

- Fees for the tournament are TBD. Please check again soon.
- Cheques can be made out to the host school. (Roland Michener Secondary School)
- There is also an additional fee for the John Paton Pay it Forward, \$1.00 per athlete which will need to be added when submitting payment.

- Registration Deadline - Registration will occur online using the Registration button on the SSA website. The online Forms include a team roster, team photo, and a brief team history. This is due by Monday, February 16, at noon.

E. GRIEVANCES & DISCIPLINE

- There are two key focuses of the Grievance/Discipline Committee at SSA provincials.
 - The first focus is to deal with matters that occur during competition, typically discipline/conduct issues, and appeals that may arise from ejections.
 - The second focus is to handle any other matters that arise that require dispute resolution.
- Grievances need to be brought up to the Grievance Chair first and will then be discussed and concluded by the committee that is made up of:
 - Host Committee Chair (to chair the Committee, only if not coaching a team competing in the Provincial Championship. If they are coaching, then someone else from the Host Committee that is not involved with coaching, should sit in)
 - Head official or designate
 - School administrator
 - SSA Commissioner or staff member (only if available)
 - Two coaches that are not in conflict of interest

F. CHANGE ROOMS

- Lockers are not available, but mens and ladies change rooms are open for athletes and their equipment.
- We ask that during the games, equipment is not stored in the viewing area downstairs .
- Change rooms have seating areas and bathroom access and are located in the downstairs viewing area of the rink

G. FIRST AID


- Teams must bring their own medical supplies and plan to do their own taping if required.
- Medical services can be located in the downstairs viewing area
- There will be medical personnel available throughout the event for emergency purposes only.

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- The Slave Lake curling club is located next to the town's Multi Rec Center. The curling club offers great viewing areas upstairs and downstairs of the 6 sheets of ice with Mirrors at the far end.

C. FOOD & BEVERAGE

- Downstairs in the curling club, a concession will be open and will be available for food and drinks throughout the event. There will also be a small canteen on site upstairs for drinks and snack purchase.
- Boston Pizza is within walking distance of the rink and the Multi Rec center next door also offers “Susan’s Kitchen” inside its lobby. There are many options within town like subway, McDonalds, A&W, Tim Horton’s and Edo.

D. HOSPITALITY

- There will be a room available for coaches, volunteers, officials, and SSA representatives in a designated area throughout the event. Athletes should not be in this area. The onsite changerooms for Athletes are spacious and comfortable for team meetings.

E. PARKING / TRANSPORTATION

- The Curling club has parking both in front of the building, as well as in the back connecting to the multi rec parking lot. There is only an entrance on the front of the building and no street parking allowed. An overflow parking area is available across the street in the No Frill’s parking lot.



F. TICKETING

- Spectators over 10 years of age will be able to purchase a three day tournament pass to all games for \$24.00. Single day passes will be sold for \$10.00. Passes are available online at <https://www.watcheschoolsport.ca/ssaprovincialtickets/> for purchase and will be scanned at the door.

G. LIVE STREAMING

- Cameras will be set up to livestream designated draws throughout the competition. Individuals/Teams are NOT allowed to livestream or videotape as per SSA policy. Livestreamed games can be viewed on the [SSA network](#).
- Livestream passes are priced \$10.00 for a single day, and \$24.00 a tournament pass.

I. SPORTSMANSHIP

SPORTSMANSHIP PINS - NOMINATION BY QR CODE SIGNAGE

- These pins should be given to individuals who exhibit outstanding displays of integrity, fair play and good sportsmanship. They may be given to athletes, coaches, parents and spectators. These individuals should be recognized for bringing positive presence to the Championship and demonstrating consistent exemplary sportsmanlike behavior. Recipients of a sportsmanship pin should show exemplary behavior.
 - Name, School, Jersey # (if applicable), and description of why they received the award.
 - Athlete/Coaches:
 - Conduct themselves in a positive nature/manner during, before and after the race
 - Be courteous, polite and friendly at all times
 - Show good sportsmanship during the race
 - Show concern, respect or empathy for an opponent-display an outstanding act of sportsmanship, ethics or integrity

SPECTATOR / PARENTS:

- Consistently give positive feedback to players/others
- Welcome opponents
- Positive comments before, during and after the game
- Be helpful to others (ie. willingly offer information about the championship, scheduling, venue locations, etc. to onlookers.

TEAM SPORTSMANSHIP AWARD

- It is encouraged to get input from all participating teams, coaches, and fans when selecting the team sportsmanship award. By including the criteria for the award in the coaches package, this will give each team a better understanding of what they should be looking for, as well as the behavior that is expected of them. This will also give you a better sense of the opposing team's view on attitude, behavior and overall sportsmanship during the game.

- One sportsmanship banner will be given to one team at the SSA Provincial Championship. The team receiving this award will represent the true spirit of sportsmanship, integrity, ethics and fair play
- At the end of each match, officials will choose two recipients of a SSA sportsmanship keychain
- Throughout the facilities, there will be a QR code that is available for spectators to scan, to nominate anybody that has demonstrated key aspects of sportsmanship throughout the event
- These nominations will be regularly reviewed by the committee throughout the event, and keychains will be distributed to celebrate certain individuals
- These nominations will also aid in the sportsmanship committees selection of the team sportsmanship recipient
- The sportsmanship committee or appropriate representative should personally award players their sportsmanship pins, at an appropriate time. When presenting pins to the athletes,, identify their name, school, behavior and compliment them on their outstanding and consistent good sportsmanship. If possible, present the pin using the PA system and in front of spectators. This presentation should be at an appropriate break in the action, after the race. Please remember that during the race it is not appropriate because players and coaches are focused on their performance and therefore the pins should be presented in between.
